* **Critical Care MCQs are distributed throughout the examination.** Of the 75 Critical Care MCQs (30% of the examination), **25 are integrated within the major pulmonary topic areas** and **50 are devoted to core Critical Care Medicine topics**. Candidates should therefore expect critical care principles to be assessed within pulmonary disease-specific questions as well as in the dedicated Critical Care Medicine section.

A. New Applicants

Applicants must submit the following:

1. Proof of current membership in the Philippine Medical Association (PMA).
2. Certificate attesting to being a Diplomate of good standing from the Philippine College of Physicians (PCP).
3. Certificate of Completion or Diploma from a PCCP-accredited Pulmonary Fellowship Training Program.
4. One (1) copy of the completed research manuscript prepared in the prescribed in PJCD format.
5. A completed fellowship training requirements checklist, certified by the Training Officer.
